Train in Trades (ACE IT) Carpentry is a district program hosted at North Delta Secondary School. This is an Industry Training Authority (ITA) Designated Trainer program that involves a combination of classroom theory and hands-on shop and real client work. The five-month program runs during the second semester of the school year (February to June). Students are in grade 11 and 12 and have formally applied and been accepted into the program. Upon successful completion of the technical training, students are awarded 16 elective graduation credits and Carpentry Level 1 from ITA. Students will be enrolled in 4 blocks (full day)

Teacher responsibilities include: Teaching students, through theory and practical work, all aspects of Level 1 Harmonized Carpentry Apprenticeship for success in course work and the final ITA Exam. Transitioning the program to the Harmonized Level 1 with support of the Coordinator. Liaise with local carpentry trades and opportunities as well as real client project work. Work with students to promote continuation in the trade through possible Work Experience, Work in Trades (SSA), and further Technical Training Levels.
